SPRING SPECIAL MUSIC SUNDAY—APRIL 28 Spring Brunch after Worship

On Sunday, April 28th the Congregational Choir, under the direction of Dr. Chris Nakielski and accompaniment of William Crouch, will perform Mozart's Missa Brevis in F Major (KV 192). The performance will feature in-house soloists Marie Von Behren, Rebecca Weatherford, and guest baritone Simon Downs. Additionally, this piece will feature area professionals on strings, including Dr. Andrew Gentszch (violin), William Gentszch (violin) and James Ellis (cello).



This mass was composed in 1774 when Mozart was just 18 years old. It became known as the "Little Credo Mass" because of the Credo calls interspersed in the text of the third movement. This Mass, intended for Sundays and minor feasts, was in any case written for Salzburg Cathedral, where the Baroque tradition remained alive in all the music performed there.

The Membership Board is hosting a Spring Brunch in Rockwood Hall after our worship that morning. During this time, we will recognize members who joined the church this past year.
