I used to have a "Little Zen Calendar," on my desk—one of those page-a-day deals that gave me a new (and often cryptic) saying every day of the week. Most days would come and go, but occasionally something would strike me and then I held onto the page. One day was greeted by the words Shunryu Suzuki, the monk who helped popularize Zen Buddhism in the United States:

"Things are always changing, so nothing can be yours."

This is a good example of what one person calls "ChristZen," a mix of Eastern and Western wisdom that is meant to transform our lives. While the above words are pure Zen in outlook, our Christian tradition holds a similar view. Nothing is ours—all that we "possess" we really hold in trust as gifts from God. And so, one of our common Christian callings is to be wise stewards—caretakers—of those gifts.

Nothing is ours. We are to be stewards of the earth, taking care of this fragile and threatened planet so that it can be passed on to future generations. We are stewards of our church property, which we received from other faithful people and which we care for so that others will benefit. We are stewards of our children—gifts, not possessions—raising them into full, independent adulthood.

In this rapidly changing world, nothing is ours. And we are, by God's grace, stewards of everything.




CONGREGATIONAL UCC MEMBERS CELEBRATE AT THE TABLE TO TABLE DINNER

If we order 50, the cost is \$16 per shirt.


