GIVING. You will find items in Rockwood Hall on November 17, December 1 & 15. We typically offer the gifts of various farm animals through the Heifer Project, as well as donations of supplies to Church World Service, and other beautiful things created by artists and craftspeople in our congregation. John Reitz is organizing these Sundays. If you are interested in participating as a vendor and he has not yet contacted you, it is not because we don't want you to participate, but he probably does not know of your interest. SHARE THE HARVEST: Following the lead of earlier church members, John Fuller and Kathy Fait have been bringing flowers and vegetables during the growing season for over 20 years. This year Andy Bertolatus and Diane Atkins shared their cucumbers and tomatoes. In past years Bob and Gloria Hanson brought lovely apples from their Wisconsin farm, and other members shared their garden produce. A free-will donation is requested for the bouquets, apples, kale, tomatoes, basil, peppers, and other veggies. This year the donations, which reflect the the generous giving from our congregation, will be sent to the CommUnity Food Bank. As of October 6, your efforts have raised over \$580 to fight food insecurity in our community.

have experienced a significant uptick in guests coming in for their services, averaging more than 105 meals served. With the higher demand, they are on the lookout for consistent volunteers who can help fulfill their mission of feeding our friends and neighbors experiencing homelessness and/or food insecurity. FALL DIAPER DRIVE FOR COMMUNITY FOOD BANK: The Mission Board is holding a diaper drive in September and October to help the Food Bank replenish its supply of diapers for families in need. The Food Bank relies on donations for non-food items such as disposable diapers. Please help babies and toddlers in our community stay dry, clean, and healthy by participating in the diaper drive. Diaper sizes 3, 4, 5, and 6 are the most needed as well as baby wipes. There are two ways you can help. Buy a package of disposable diapers and wipes and bring them to Rockwood Hall. We will ensure that everything is delivered to the Food Bank. Or, if you would like to make a personal donation to support this drive, please write a check to the church with Diaper Drive on the memo line and the Mission Board will use the funds to purchase diapers. Whichever way you choose, your donation will help restock the Food Bank's diaper supply, provide free diapers for babies and toddlers in need and bring some economic relief to families.
