ALL SAINTS SUNDAY: Each year on the First Sunday in November, Congregational UCC observes "All Saints Sunday." This is a time for us to remember and give thanks to God for the lives of those members of Congregational UCC who have died in the past year—and for all the saints. This year we remember Joan Jehle, Ken Kuntz, Joan Parsons, David Schoonover, and Fern Weir. Our worship service on this day is both solemn and joyful, befitting a congregation of people who live in the light of the resurrection. As is our custom, a jazz band leads our worship on this morning to help us look toward that day when the saints go marchin' in. Our friend, the well-known local jazz pianist Dick Watson, is joined by Lynne Hart on sax, Gary Palmer on bass and Craig Wood on drums.

WE WILL RECEIVE OUR NEIGHBORS IN NEED (NIN) OFFERING THIS MORNING: NIN is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice.

OUR MISSION BOARD IS PLANNING THIS YEAR'S ALTERNATIVE CHRISTMAS

GIVING. We will hold our alternative Christmas gift fair in Rockwood Hall after worship on the following Sundays before Christmas: November 17 and December 1 and 15. We will offer a variety of unusual gift items, including the ever-popular Heifer Project animal gifts with gift cards bearing Ginny Clemons' graceful calligraphy, relief items for Church World Service to distribute, and intriguing and unique gifts crafted by artists and craftspeople in our congregation.

SHARE THE HARVEST: Following the lead of earlier church members, John Fuller and Kathy Fait have been bringing flowers and vegetables during the growing season for over 20 years. This year Andy Bertolatus and Diane Atkins shared their cucumbers and tomatoes.
